Notwithstanding the provisions relating to the minimum dimensions of a lot, where a cadastral operation is necessary in order to extract a building used for commercial or industrial purposes from an agricultural entity, the width of the lot may be reduced to 120 meters and the area to 10,000 square meters. In addition, the lot resulting from this cadastral operation must be of regular shape and include an access road with a minimum width of 6 meters across its entire width.

In the case of a new building, the minimum dimensions prescribed in the first paragraph apply and the lot must be adjacent to an existing street on the date this By-law comes into force.

For the purposes of the two preceding paragraphs, in the event that the Act respecting the protection of agricultural land and activities applies, authorization from the Agricultural Land Protection Commission (CPTAQ) will also be required.

ARTICLE 3 - ENTRY INTO FORCE:

This By-law shall come into force in accordance with the Act.

ARTICLE 1 – PREAMBLE

The preamble to this Draft By-law forms an integral part thereof.

ARTICLE 2

This By-law is entitled Draft By-law No. 373-2025 concerning speed limits.

ARTICLE 3

No person shall drive a road vehicle at a speed greater than that specified in Schedule A.

ARTICLE 4

Appropriate signage shall be installed by the Municipality's Public Works Department.

ARTICLE 5

Anyone who contravenes section 2 of this Draft By-law is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine as provided for in section 516 or 516.1 of the Highway Safety Code.

ARTICLE 6

Except on roads where signs to the contrary appear as described in Appendix "A" and attached to this by-law to form an integral part thereof, and without limiting the scope of section 327 of the Highway Safety Code (L.R.Q., c. C-24.2), no person shall drive a road vehicle at a speed exceeding:

o 50 km/h on roads within the territory of the Municipality of the Township of Harrington.

o The speed indicated by a sign displaying a message that specifies, according to the circumstances and time of day, the maximum speed authorized on the section of road covered by that sign.

This By-law shall come into force in accordance with the Act.

To provide for the expenses incurred in respect of interest and principal payments on the annual instalments of the loan, there is hereby imposed and shall be levied annually during the term of the loan on all taxable real property located within the territory of the Municipality a special tax at a rate sufficient to cover the value of the property as shown on the assessment roll in effect each year.

ARTICLE 6

If the amount of an appropriation authorized by this By-law exceeds the amount actually spent in connection with that appropriation, the Council is authorized to use the surplus to pay any other expenditure authorized by this By-law for which the appropriation proves insufficient.

ARTICLE 7

The Council shall apply any contribution or subsidy that may be paid to it for the payment of part or all of the expenditure authorized by this By-law to the reduction of the loan authorized by this By-law.

The Council shall also apply any subsidy payable over several years to the payment of part or all of the debt service. The repayment term of the loan corresponding to the amount of the subsidy shall be automatically adjusted to the period set for the payment of the subsidy.

ARTICLE 8

In the event of any discrepancy between the French and English texts, the French text shall prevail.

ARTICLE 9

This By-law shall come into force in accordance with the law.
