ARTICLE 4

For the purpose of paying the expenses provided for in this By-law, the Council is authorized to borrow the sum of \$554,123 over a period of 20 years.

ARTICLE 5

To provide for the expenses incurred in respect of interest and principal repayments on the annual maturities of the loan, a special tax shall be imposed by this By-law and shall be levied annually during the term of the loan on all taxable real estate located within the Municipality at a rate sufficient to cover the expenses as they appear on the assessment roll in effect each year.

ARTICLE 6

If the amount of an appropriation authorized by this By-law is greater than the amount actually spent in connection with that appropriation, the Council is authorized to use the surplus to pay any other expense decreed by this By-law for which the appropriation would prove insufficient.

ARTICLE 7

The Council shall allocate to the reduction of the loan decreed by this By-law any contribution or subsidy that may be paid to it for the payment of part or all of the expenditure decreed by this By-law.

The Council shall also allocate to the payment of part or all of the debt service any subsidy payable over several years. The repayment term of the loan corresponding to the amount of the subsidy shall be automatically adjusted to the period set for the payment of the subsidy.

ARTICLE 8
